Regular Meeting Minutes
April 17, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Supervisor, Jacque Phillippe. Board members present were Pitts, Pugsley, Bregger, and DeLeo.

The March minutes were read, Motion by DeLeo supported by Pitts to approve the minutes. Motion carried

Police Report-- There were 31 calls in the township with (2) Assaults, (1) Larceny, (1) Drug Arrest, .

Fire Report-- There were (39) calls with (8) in the township., /this brings the year to date total to 142. Derrick informed the Board that the department is conducting inspections of all business's. This has resulted in the discovery of several building code violation which are being addressed by our building code inspectors.

Hospital Report-- The CEO of the hospital in South Haven and several of her staff were in attendance to give the Board an overview of what's happening currently. On May 6, 2013 a new urgent care facility will open with walk-in hours 7 days a week. The hospital has been working with Bronson Hospital in implementing a new digital medical records system. The hospital currently has low debt with cash on hand and is operating on a 1 ½% margin. The hospital currently employs 400 people..

Supervisor's Report-- The painting project inside the Hall is progressing slowly. A discussion of the County Road Rating System will be discussed at a later meeting. Do we need a tire disposal program?

Clerk Report-- There will be an election for the Lawrence School System on May 7, 2013.

Planning Commission-- Jim Funke reported on their April 3, 2013 meeting. The commission has dissolved the Borah Special Use Permit. All Special Use permits regarding sand and gravel will be reviewed at the June meeting. A public Hearing will be held on June 3, 2013 about the revised zoning plan.

Enforcement-- Habitat for Humanity was cited for building code violations at its new facility just east of Bangor. The new Mexican Market on M-43 is getting the required permits to open.
