

Arlington Township
Regular Meeting Minutes
April 19, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Supervisor, Jacque Phillippe. Board members present were Pitts, Pugsley, DeLeo, and Melvin.

The minutes of the March meeting were read. Motion by Pitts supported by Melvin to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Police Report-- Jason Avery noted that there had been 38 calls in the township.

Fire Report-- Lawrence-- There were 2 calls in the township. The department now has 24 members.

Bangor-- there were 48 calls with 14 in the township. The 1931 Reo Firetruck will be getting a new motor and transmission to make it easier to use. The 2017-2018 Fire Budget has now be ratified by all parties/

Road Commission Report-- Jacque has received estimates for approximately 3000 tons of gravel and to sealcoat 48th St.

Special Guest-- Judge McKay was present to give us an update on the proposed Court expansion plans. Regardless of whether the requested Millage vote passes or not, the expansion project for the Jail will proceed.

Commissioner's Report-- Palisades Nuclear Plant will close in 2018.

Seniors Report-- Doug reported that everything is going well.

Assessor Report-- The July Board of Review will be held on July 18, 2017.

Planning Commission Report-- Letters will be going out to all surrounding townships and government bodies informing them that we intend to update our Master Plan. All Special Use Permits will be up for renewal at the next planning meeting in June.

Ordinance Enforcement-- The renter should be evicted on the McPike property on 48th ^{Ave.} soon. Dave Letten will soon have a civil infraction ticked issued, Mr. Mims will also be ticketed for violations soon. Motion by DeLeo supported by Pitts to pay for a Process Server in Florida to serve the owner of the Wallace property.

Clerk Report--Pugsley reminded everyone to vote at the May 2, 2017 election.

Supervisor Report-- Perhaps we need a sign-in sheet for all non-township employees who enter the township hall.

Treasurer Report-- Motion by DeLeo supported by Pitts to pay the Bills with corrections. All members voted in the affirmative.

Township Hall Roof replacement and Painting-- Annie Funke reminded the Board that we still need to pursue this project this year.
